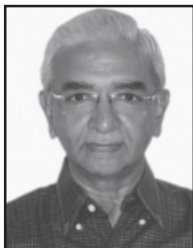

Sanitary Napkin“ SanjivaniSuraksha”

With support of S. M. Nanavati Charitable Trust we had started mfg. of sanitary pads in 2015. Till date we have manufactured more than 4,00,000 pads & distributed >3,00,000 pads. We have been providing sanitary napkins for free through our mobile medical vans. Over and above this we have distributed pads for free to various NGOs and organisations like-

- ‘Manthan’ Apang Kanya Seva Sankul, Kalol
- Blind people’s Association, Ahmedabad
- Shiv Prathmik Shala Complex, Ahmedabad
- Vikas Group, Ahmedabad

This year we have tied up and entered in MOU with ‘SEWA’ i.e. Self Employed Women Association, Ahmedabad, have trained their 50+ Gramya Sevikas for this project through one day workshop as to benefit from use of napkins, method of use and disposal of pads and have provided kit to work in villages.

Under Project NCD : Over and above services provided by our team, we are desirous of making service of Diabetes and blood pressure detection services available at all villages, this year we have entered in MOU with ‘SEWA’ – trained their 12 gramya sevikas at our centre and have provided free kit for this project to spread this facility to more and more villages.

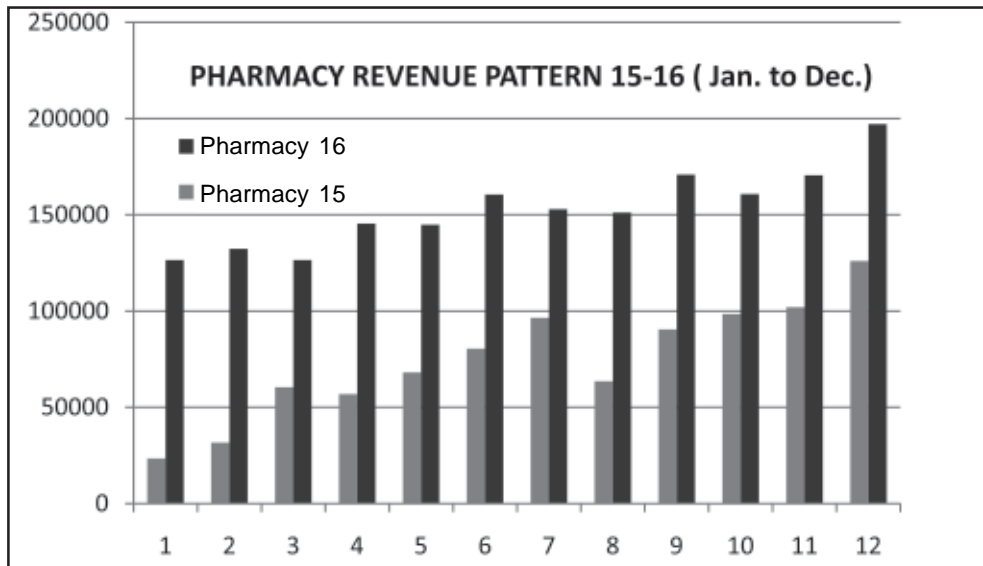
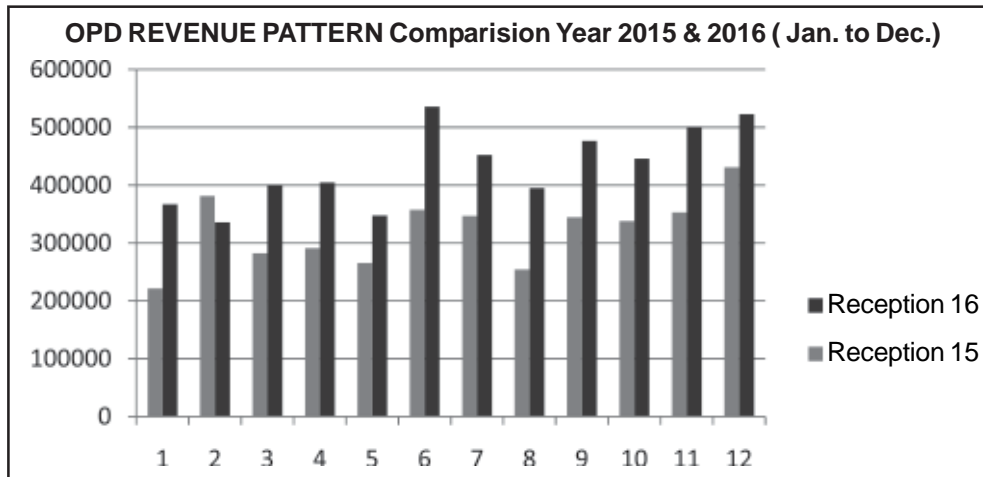

Educational Activity

As you know Sanjivani started free support education classes(Tuitions) for any students from any school in 2012. Motivated by results of our dedicated team of teachers, especially Shri Kiranbhai C. Shah and Shri Dineshbhai Dhandhara, we decided to have our own school where we can teach more number of students from under privileged community.

In 2014, Sanjivani entered in MOU with authorities of “ Shiv Prathmik Shala” barrage Road, Vasna and renovated 28 years old building of school. Got permission for English medium primary school, “**Sanjivani Vidhyavihar**”.

After completing formalities of NA, NOC and BU permission, we entered in purchase deed and with generous donations from-

- Shri Lalji Mehrotra Charitable Trust, Mumbai
- Shri Nishit P Kothari family - Jewelex - Middle East
- Shri Jitendrabhai B. Shah - Belgium

We could purchase, renovate and convert the school in high tech school with –

- 5 smart classes with projectors and screens
- 2 computer labs with 70 PCs for Software based education program through server
- 1 projector room with all modern educational gadgets to provide technologically enriched education through our affiliated NGO Padmavati Education Trust headed by trustees from Sanjivani- SHRC.

With generous support from GRUH Finance Limited, Ahmedabad we were able to provide free mid - day snacks since two years, high in nutritional value free of cost to students.

- Shri Pravinbhai Shantilal Kothari, Jewelex India, Mumbai
- Shiv Pre-primary, Primary and secondary school (Gujarati medium) from K.G. to Std.10th.
